CMC South Announces the "Susie Hakansson Award" for Fostering Emerging Leadership of Math Educators of Color

Beginning February 1, 2013, nominations will be accepted by CMC South to recognize CMC members, up to three individuals annually, who successfully and steadfastly foster the leadership capacity of and leadership opportunities offered to mathematics educators of color. Awards in the amount of \$500, \$1000 or \$1500 will be made by March 15, 2013, with the stipulation that recipients will employ such funds to actively engage and support outstanding mathematics educators of color in leadership development work in 2013-2014.

Growing Leaders, Advancing Equity and Excellence

Over many decades, Susie Hakansson has taken every opportunity to ensure that California's mathematics education leadership reflects the diversity of our state.

In doing so, Susie has quietly and purposefully facilitated the journey into leadership of many leaders of color. She models what it means to mentor and encourage leaders of color, so that all aspects of mathematics education are enhanced through a growing and deepening community of leaders.



*What does CMC South mean by a "leader of color"?
A leader of mathematics education of African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Asian/Pacific Islander or Native American descent.*

The California Mathematics Council (CMC) believes that all students have the capacity to become mathematically competent and confident when provided a rigorous and challenging mathematical program supported by high expectations.

Other CMC South Awards and Scholarships:

In addition to the new "Susie Hakansson Award," CMC South offers the:

*Javor Mentor-Mentee Award
Nominations of a K-8 math teacher in their first five years of teaching, and the CMC member mentoring them, are due October 1st of each year.*

*Lurie Center (South) K-8 Award
Nominations are due September 30th of each year, of K-8 math teachers of students of color who offer enriching pathways to excellence.*

Scholarships to foster professional learning, up to \$2000 per educator, pre-service or inservice are available by application, due January 31st.

The awards and scholarships listed in this brochure are funded largely through membership dues paid by your fellow pre-K to 16 mathematics educators to the California Mathematics Council.
